Dear Parent(s), Parishioners(s), and Student(s):

Welcome to St. Rita's Religious Education Program. We are excited about this new year and hope that you and your child are ready to enter into a relationship with Christ and learn about our Catholic faith.

Information regarding our Religious Education Program, such as registration forms, Parent/Student Handbook, and important dates, can be located at St. Rita Church web address: church@strita.brcoxmail.com.

As part of the Diocesan Policy in order to protect all of our children, all teachers must participate in a Safe-Environment Seminar. St. Rita Church provides education resources for children, clergy, and laity (employees and volunteers) in the prevention of and recognition of child abuse. If you are interested in participating in a Safe-Environment Seminar, please contact me at the number below.

Students in grades K-11 will participate in a safe-environment activity on the first day of class. Students are required to read a book entitled: "For Pete's Sake—Tell." This book is about a storybook animation character, Peter Mouse. His experience helps children become alert and assertive when personality is at stake. This book will be reviewed and discussed at the beginning of the first religion class period. All parents are welcome to join us as we view this book. As you recall, you have an option to allow or not allow your child to participate in this activity as indicated on the registration form. If you choose not to allow your child to participate in the safe-environment program, I must have a letter from you indicating how you shared safe environment strategies with your child. This letter must be signed and dated and given to me on the first day of class.

If you have suffered abuse, it is not your fault. If you are a victim of sexual abuse, there are several things you can do:

- Contact the appropriate law enforcement agency, which can help determine options for making a criminal complaint.
- Contact a local child protection agency, a private attorney, a support group, an abuse hotline, or a mental health professional,
- If your abuse occurred by anyone acting in church service, contact Mr. Joseph Pisano's (337-298-2987) diocesan Victim Assistance Coordinator, who is available to help victims/survivors obtain support for the needs of the individual, individual's family, or other person affected.

How to Report Abuse:

- ◆ If suspected abuse is by a parent or caretaker, call 855-4LA-KIDS (855-452-5437)
- ◆ If suspected abuse is by someone other than parent or caretaker, call your local law enforcement agency

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION PROGRAM: REGISTRATION

The registration fee is \$15.00 per family of one and \$25.00 per family of two or more. A registration form must be completed on each child and returned with the correct fee in a sealed envelope. A late fee will be charged to any late registrations. The form may be placed in the offertory basket during the Mass on the weekend with *religion* written on the sealed envelope. It can also be dropped off at the rectory during business hours, or mailed to the rectory at:

NOTE: Kindergarten, Second graders, and Confirmation students MUST have a copy of their BAPTISMAL CERTIFICATE at the time of registration.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION PROGRAM: TEACHERS

The Religious Education Director and all teachers work on a voluntary basis. This is a ministry of tremendous value to our children and our faith community. They have heard the call of Jesus and have answered...YES! They are honoring their baptismal promise. Let us support them in their ministry of teaching the Gospel message. If you have any questions or concerns, please contact the Director of Religious Education Ray Latiolais @ 394-4030. If needed, a meeting will be convened.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION PROGRAM: MATERIALS

The teacher will advise students as to what supplies are required for class. Students are required to come to each class with a notebook and a pen/pencil.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION PROGRAM: DISCIPLINE

Teachers will instruct students concerning their discipline policy. The teacher will decide upon appropriate consequences and rewards. Continued disruptions and disrespect by a student will be a cause to have the student removed from the class and sent home. Following a parent meeting, the student may be allowed to return to the class. Individual transgressions will be handled in an appropriate manner, in regard to its seriousness, and/or disregard for proper social behavior. Parents are invited to visit the classes. This makes your child and others aware of your interest in their faith journey.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION PROGRAM: ATTENDANCE

Students are required to attend all scheduled classes at specified times and dates. Since Dion Hall is used as a community funeral home, in the event there is a wake; being exposed, classes will be cancelled and held the following week.

EXCUSED ABSENCES:

- **Death in the family**
- **Sickness (student or family member)**
- **Medical appointments**

For a student to be excused, one of the following is required:

- **A parent note to the teacher**
- **A parent phone call to the teacher or parish secretary**
- **A doctor's excuse**

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION PROGRAM: LESSONS AND CLASSWORK

Teachers will:

- **Instruct students as to what is expected of them concerning class work**
- **Follow a lesson design during the delivery of the lesson**
- **Upon a student's absence, provide make-up work for the student. It is up to the parent to see that the make-up work is completed. If the work is not completed, it will be at the discretion of the Pastor and Director of Religious Education to decide whether summer make-up classes will be required to enter the next grade level**
- **If a student is home schooled, the parent must receive permission from the Religious Education Director.**

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION PROGRAM: EVALUATIONS

Teachers in each class will decide upon the appropriate evaluation tool to use with the students.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION PROGRAM: FIRST COMMUNION and CONFIRMATION

Candidates for First Communion and Confirmation are required to attend special classes, activities, and practice. The teachers will inform parents and students of the requirements in order to receive the sacrament. It is the parent's responsibility to insure that all requirements are completed before the sacrament is received.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION PROGRAM: DROP-OFF AND PICK-UP OF STUDENTS

Parents are to make sure that there is an adult present when leaving students at the appointed place where classes will be held. For the safety of our students, parents of students in grades K, 1, and 2 are asked to get down to pick-up their child.

Catholic Facts and General Knowledge

Catholic Belief

- I. To gain the happiness of heaven we must know, love, and serve God in this world. Man must know, love and serve God in a supernatural manner in order to gain the happiness of heaven. Man is raised to the supernatural order only by Supernatural Grace, a free gift of God bestowed on man at Christian Baptism
- II. We learn to know, love, and serve God from Jesus Christ, the Son of God, who teaches us through the Catholic Church.
- III. In order to be saved, all persons who have attained the use of reason must believe explicitly that God exist and that He rewards the good and punishes the wicked; in practice, they must also believe in the mysteries of the Blessed Trinity and the Incarnation.
- IV. By the Blessed Trinity we mean one and the same God in three divine persons, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost.
- V. By the Incarnation is meant that the Son of God, retaining His divine nature, took to Himself a human nature, that is, a body and soul like ours.
- VI. The Church is the congregation of all baptized persons united in the same true faith, the same sacrifice, and the same sacraments, under the authority of the Sovereign Pontiff and the bishops in communion with him.
- VII. We find the chief truths taught by Jesus Christ through the Catholic Church in the Apostle's Creed.

The Ten Commandments of God

- I. I am the Lord your God; you shall not have strange gods before me.**
- II. You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain.**
- III. Remember to keep holy the Lord's day**
- IV. Honor your father and your mother.**

ROMAN CATHOLICISM'S HOLY DAYS OF OBLIGATION

In Roman Catholicism, Holy Days of Obligation are the days other than Sundays when Catholics are obligated to attend Mass. Below are the Holy Days of Obligation:

- * All Sundays of the Calendar Year
- * December 8, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception
- * December 25, the Solemnity of the Nativity of Our Lord Jesus Christ
- * January 1, the Solemnity of Mary
- * Thursday of the Sixth Week of Easter, the Solemnity of the Ascension

In our diocese, this Solemnity is celebrated the Sunday following Ascension Thursday.

- * August 15, the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary
- * November 1, the Solemnity of All Saints

***Our Catholic Faith obliges the student and their family to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation. If it is not possible for parents to attend Mass on Sunday and Holy Days of Obligation, we encourage parents to make arrangements for a relative or a friend to accompany their children to Mass. Religious education, without Mass attendance, makes it difficult for students to relate to the materials being taught in the classroom.**

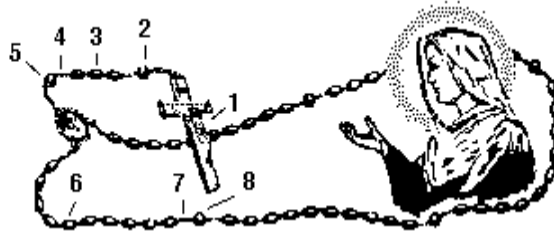
NOTE:

THE ROSARY

Six fundamental prayers are part of the Catholic rosary, a devotion dedicated to the Blessed Virgin, the Mother of God. (CCC 971). The rosary consists of fifteen decades. Each decade focuses upon a particular mystery in the life of Christ and his Blessed Mother. It is customary to say five decades at a time, while meditating upon one set of mysteries.

Joyful Mysteries (Mondays and Saturdays)

- I. The Annunciation
- II. The Visitation
- III. The Birth of our Lord
- IV. The Presentation of our Lord
- V. The Finding of our Lord in the Temple

Sorrowful Mysteries (Tuesdays and Fridays)

- I. The Agony in the Garden
- II. The Scourging at the Pillar
- III. The Crowning with Thorns
- IV. The Carrying of the Cross
- V. The Crucifixion and Death of our Lord

Glorious Mysteries (Wednesdays and Sundays)

- I. The Resurrection
- II. The Ascension
- III. The Descent of the Holy Spirit
- IV. The Assumption of our Blessed Mother into Heaven
- V. The Coronation of Mary as Queen of Heaven and Earth

Luminous Mysteries (Thursdays)

- I. The Baptism, of our Lord, in the Jordan
- II. The Wedding at Cana
- III. The Proclamation of the Kingdom of God
- IV. The Transfiguration
- V. The Institution of the Eucharist



STATIONS OF THE CROSS

The Stations may be of stone, wood, or metal, sculptured or carved, or they may be merely paintings or engravings. Some Stations are valuable works of art, as those, for instance, in Antwerp cathedral, which have been much copied elsewhere. They are usually ranged at intervals around the walls of a church, though sometimes they are to be found in the open air, especially on roads leading to a church or shrine. In monasteries they are often placed in the cloisters. The erection and use of the Stations did not become at all general before the end of the seventeenth century, but they are now to be found in almost every church. Formerly their number varied considerably in different places but fourteen are now prescribed by authority. They are as follows:

1. Christ condemned to death;
2. The cross is laid upon him;
3. His first fall;
4. He meets His Blessed Mother;
5. Simon of Cyrene is made to bear the cross;
6. Christ's face is wiped by Veronica;
7. His second fall;
8. He meets the women of Jerusalem;
9. His third fall;
10. He is stripped of His garments;
11. His crucifixion;
12. His death on the cross;
13. His body is taken down from the cross; and
14. Jesus' body is laid in the tomb.

GUIDE OF EXAMINATION OF CONSCIENCE FOR CONFESSION OF SINS

5 STEPS FOR A GOOD CONFESSION

1. Examine your conscience-what sins have you committed since your last good confession?
2. Be sincerely sorry for your sins.
3. Make certain that you confess all your mortal sins and the number of them.
4. After confession, do the penance the priest gives to you.
5. Pray daily for the strength to avoid the occasion of sin, especially for those sins you were just absolved from.

EASTER DUTY

The obligation is for members of the Catholic Church to approach the Sacrament of Penance, if in a state of mortal sin, once a year, and also of receiving the Holy Eucharist, as a mark of fidelity to membership, and under penalty of exclusion from it and all rights as a Catholic. The prescribed time for fulfilling the Easter duty extends: from the first Sunday of Lent to Trinity Sunday, in the United States; One may follow the direction of his priest judging it proper for him to abstain for some time, if necessary, but the precept binds even after the time has expired and is not fulfilled by an unworthy communion.

PRAYERS

Pope John Paul II indicates that people sometimes say they don't know how to pray. "How to pray? This is a simple matter. I would say: *Pray any way you like, so long as you do pray.*" You can pray the way your mother taught you; you can use a prayer book. Sometimes it takes courage to pray; but it is possible to pray, and necessary to pray. Whether from memory or a book or just in thought, it is all the same. *See, John Paul II, The Way of Prayer, Crossroad Publishing Co. (1995).*

GRADE KINDERGARTEN (CREATION) SYMBOL: STARS, EARTH, SUN

God was before anything else. He made man and woman like Himself.

GRADE 1 (ADAM AND EVE) SYMBOL: BITE IN AN APPLE

Adam and Eve do not do what God wants them to do. They disobeyed God and He punished them.

GRADE 2 (NOAH'S ARK) SYMBOL: THE ARK AND RAINBOW

After Adam and Eve, people continued to try to do things their own way instead of God's way. Each time they got into trouble, God shows them that they are still important to Him. Finally, things get so bad that He decides to destroy everything in a flood. He finds a family who will obey Him and places them and all kinds of creatures on the Ark.

GRADE 3 (ABRAHAM) SYMBOL: LAMB

God keeps his promise to Abraham and Sari. Soon their son, Isaac, is born. Their names change to Abraham and Sarah. Abraham still trusts in God even when it seems that God wants him to kill Isaac. However, God does not want Abraham to kill his son, but to be obedient.

GRADE 4 (MOSES) SYMBOL: TABLETS, STAFF, BURNING BUSH

Abraham's descendants are multiplying, as God promised, but now they are being held as slaves in Egypt. God will not leave them to suffer for long. He chooses Moses to lead them to freedom and promises Moses that He will be with him to solve the many problems they will face.

GRADE 5 (JOSHUA) SYMBOL: RAM, HORN, TRUMPET

Moses dies before God brings the people to the land He has promised them. So, Joshua becomes their leader. But whoever the leader is, God is still in charge. He shows them how to take each city He has allotted them, and they win victories by His power.

GRADE 6 (JOSEPH) SYMBOL: CARPENTER, SAW, HAMMER

Matthew introduces Joseph, through whose eyes we see some different things about Mary's special child. Jesus will save people from their sins. Especially all the sins that they have committed through the centuries. Also, God will be truly present with His people.

GRADE 7 (MARY) SYMBOL: LILY OR ROSE

Mary is chosen to be the Mother of Christ. After the angel visits her, she races to visit her cousin Elizabeth, who is pregnant with St. John. Mary tells the Good news to her cousin.

GRADE 8/9 (JESUS) SYMBOL: CHI-RHO, LIGHT OF THE WORLD

The baby is born. God has united Himself to Israel and to all humanity in the flesh of a child. From now on, God will be standing beside us to put right the things that go wrong and to bring us back to His path when we get off.

GRADE 10/11 (LIFE OF JESUS) SYMBOL: JESUS' FAMILY

When they had departed, behold, the angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and said, "Rise, take the child and his mother, flee to Egypt, and stay there until I tell you. Herod is going to search for the child to destroy him." Joseph rose and took the child and his mother by night and departed for Egypt."
